Special International Double Issue: Globalization and Women's Offending, the Social Control of Women, Women's Victimization, and Anti-Feminist Backlash

Feminist Criminology invites manuscript submissions for consideration for a forthcoming double issue on international or global trends in policy responses to women's offending, women's imprisonment, and women's victimization. Both qualitative and quantitative submissions are encouraged, which draw from international, comparative or country based data including especially data from jurisdictions outside the United States. For Part One we seek submissions on the impacts or context of globalization either on female involvement in crime (specific or overall), on the social control of women, especially their imprisonment, or on the victimization of women. For Part Two we seek submissions on feminist responses to anti-feminist "backlash," including empirical research, theoretical analysis, and practice-oriented papers on successful and not-so successful efforts by feminist academics, practitioners, and activists to counter efforts by anti-feminist entities to discredit and reverse feminist-inspired policy around intimate partner violence, gendered preventions, gendered corrections, and other initiatives broadly relevant to gender and crime.

Manuscripts should be submitted in electronic format, not exceeding 30 double-spaced typed pages, with a 100-word abstract and a brief autobiographical sketch. Figures, tables and references must be on separate pages and should follow the format specified in the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (5th Edition).
